


ELLIE WATERS | PRESIDENT (STUDENT VOICE)

Union Governance


- Working with the university and the student body to ensure you are academically advocated for fairly

Hi, I'm **Olivia (she/her)**, and I'm running to be your **President (Student Voice)**

During my time at University, I have made it my goal to represent **YOU!** I have spent two years being **YOUR Student Officer**, chaired both the **Commuting Students Network and Access**, been a **StAR for Law**, and **co-chaired the Disability & Equality Interest Group**. Through this I have sat on multiple committees, and been the only current student in rooms where decisions were made, but **student feedback did NOT always translate into meaningful change**.



STUDENT VOICE STARTS WITH YOU

- Student voice has often been treated as a tick box, rather than influence. I would change this by:
 - Getting **YOU into the rooms where decisions** that impact your student experience are being made.
 - Strengthening how you can share **your voice so feedback leads to clear visible outcomes**.
 - **Requiring transparent responses from the University and Students' Union** so you can see how decisions are made and why.
 - Ensure **policies are assessed based on their real impact on YOU**, so decisions reflect you, not assumptions.
- I will listen to **YOU**, and let **YOUR VOICE** lead.

STUDENT EXPERIENCE SHOULD REFLECT YOUR REALITY

- Student life doesn't always fit into outdated systems, and it shouldn't have to. I will modernise the student experience by:
 - Bringing **back self-certification** or expanding the current EC policy to cover what was lost.
 - Ensuring all courses have **block timetabling** and opportunities to **join online** when needed.
 - Advocate for all **policies to be more inclusive**, so they **do not negatively impact underrepresented groups**, such as the attendance policy.
 - **Improve the SU and University websites** so that information can be found more easily, especially in regards to academic policies.
- If the system doesn't work for **YOU**, I will change it so it **DOES**.

PROTECT WHAT WORKS. IMPROVE WHAT DOESN'T

- We must protect the services that **YOU** value, while improving what can be better. If elected, I will:
 - **Protect the services YOU value most** during financially challenging times, ensuring your experience is not compromised.
 - Deliver and strengthen my **Heating Campaign and Safe Taxi Scheme**, with full implementation by November 2026.
 - Revamp the StAR scheme by **improving training, strengthening ongoing support**, and ensuring students know who their StAR is, so **student voice leads to meaningful change**.
 - Continue **celebrating student achievements** by reintroducing StAR of the Week and expanding **recognition of successes both inside and outside the University**.


RYAN BECK | PRESIDENT (STUDENT ENGAGEMENT)



THEO HAYES | PART-TIME OFFICER

- AI Policy - make sure the university is not being hypocritical/running a double standard when it comes to their AI usage policy and make sure lecturers, admin and leadership are held to the same standards and expectations we students are when it comes to AI usage.
- Data security - ensure transparency of who the union and the university partner with when it comes to websites, databases or any other product where student data is handled, this is so students can view and research who these companies are, who they have links/partnerships with and what they might do with our data. This is so the student voice can be heard louder so they can have a say in who we should partner with in these fields
- Inclusivity - have a SU spearheaded open door policy to hear concerns from students about inclusivity within the uni whether that be racial, gender, sexuality, disability, etc inclusivity and see if we can help make changes for the better
- Digital suggestion box - add a suggestion portal to the website where students can submit suggestions for the SU (vault events, changes for SU shops/terrace, competitions, events, etc) which will be put on a notice board like page (after being moderated) where other students can vote for them so the SU knows how popular certain ideas are and can then prioritise what to consider
- identify any surpluses in the budget and work out a new beneficial scheme to use it for (most likely use suggestions for this too)
- offer more help and advice for students wanting to start their own club/society
- focus on taking critique and responses from students following major SU led/spearheaded events and use them to improve how we might do them in the future or make the changes for any future events
- Student Union app for event updates, shops/terrace news, notice board, as well as a mobile platform for the content that is on the website, and prioritise the idea of contracting this idea to students within the university rather than some third party developers



PATRICK STEPHENS | PART-TIME OFFICER

My name is Patrick Stephens, and I am standing to be one of your next Part Time Officers because I believe every student at Winchester deserves a university experience that is inclusive, empowering, and genuinely supportive. University should be more than lectures and deadlines — it should be a place where students grow socially, personally, and practically. My campaign is built around three key priorities: strengthening societies, creating inclusive social alternatives, and promoting essential life skills.



First, I will focus on society development. Societies are one of the most powerful ways students build friendships, improve mental wellbeing, and find like-minded communities — especially when settling into university life away from home. However, too many students with great ideas face unnecessary barriers when trying to start a new society. I will campaign to reduce the current threshold from 15 members (a committee plus 10 members) to 8 members (a committee plus 3 members). This change would make it significantly easier to launch new and unique societies, giving students more opportunities to socialise in Winchester rather than feeling they need to travel elsewhere. I will also work to reduce unnecessary administrative red tape in both starting and joining societies. Societies should feel supported, not restricted.

Second, I want to introduce stronger alternatives to traditional nightlife events. While BOP is a valued part of student culture and should absolutely continue, it does not represent everyone's idea of socialising. Many students — including those who do not drink or who simply prefer a different atmosphere — can feel excluded. University social life should not be one-size-fits-all. I will advocate for regular alternative events such as game nights, relaxed social evenings, and interactive activities in spaces like The Vault or other suitable venues. These events would create inclusive environments where students can socialise, build friendships, and feel part of campus life without pressure to drink. Everyone deserves a space where they feel comfortable.

Third, I am passionate about improving life skills support. University is often the first time students live independently, yet many arrive without basic practical knowledge. I will push to introduce initiatives such as "Freshers Foods" — workshops designed to teach simple cooking skills, budgeting basics, and other essential life skills. Promoting healthy living and independence not only supports wellbeing but helps students feel more confident and capable throughout their studies and beyond. At the heart of my campaign is inclusion, accessibility, and practical action. I believe the Students' Union should actively shape student life by listening carefully and acting decisively. My goal is not to replace what works, but to build on it — expanding opportunities so that every student can find their place at Winchester.

I care deeply about creating a campus culture where students feel connected, supported, and equipped for life beyond university. If elected, I will work to ensure that societies thrive, social spaces are inclusive, and students graduate not only with degrees, but with confidence and real-world skills.
