



- Sexual Health Clinic drop-ins on campus, including free STI kits.


Represent & Champion

- Launch a 'Student Recruiters scheme' - Students should be involved in every decision made at the University, including recruitment.
- Launch a 'WinCHARITY Day' twice a semester which focuses on and celebrates volunteering and charity work.
- 'Grill the Vice-Chancellor' giving students the opportunity to question our VC. It's time we held her to account.
- Implore the University shout about student success as much as the Union, celebrating real students in their institution
- Ensure a second Student Governor is put on the University's Board of Governors, ensuring real student representation is heard from the classroom to the boardroom.
- Introduce a 'Welcome to Winchester' scheme during enrolment. Guaranteeing every student gets the chance to speak to their SU in that critical first week.

Equip & Provide

- Increase study space across campus, purchasing roll-away furniture that can be used in The Vault when unoccupied
- Introduce a 'Change Week' where students can submit ideas for change to an online leaderboard and other students can vote – helping us know what to work on.
- Maintain SU presence at the new West Downs Centre. Keep the (currently at threat) SU Shop, and acquire additional space for an Advice Centre Hub.
- Urge the University for an out of hours Park&Ride shuttle bus. With students unable to park on campus, and buses stopping at 8pm, students are often prevented from staying late for lectures, studying or attending societies/sports.
- Introduce a Daytime Freshers Wristband to create different socialising opportunities beyond the Vault.

Ensure the uphold of the Union's principles



BETH STEPHENS (PRESIDENT)



Election Statement:

A vote for Beth Stephens is a vote for YOUR safety, YOUR education and YOUR experience.

Manifesto:

Hello, my name is Beth Stephens and I am 3rd year Theology, Religion and Ethics student. I am running to be your next President because I am an honest, determined and approachable person who is ready to listen to you and improve YOUR university experience. I want to be able to represent the entire student body and allow YOUR voice to be heard. In my time at university I have become a StAR (Student Academic Rep) for my course as well as being deputy-chair of my course SSCL (Student Staff Liaison Committee). Since my second year I have already been closely involved with the Student Union as I work with the venue team as a Bar Supervisor so you can always catch me at BOP. I am also a member of the Music Centre so spend a lot of my free time involved with their extracurricular activities, one of my key responsibilities being that I help run the Concert Band.

If elected these are the key areas I want to focus upon;

YOUR Safety:

- Street lights – start a conversation with Winchester City Council in order to encourage the street lights to be turned back on to enforce the safety of students walking home late be it from BOP or jobs etc.
- Ask Angela – make students aware that the student union engages with this initiative and enforce staff training within the SU so students who require this service can trust in our staff.
- Safety Bus – encourage more people to volunteer in order to ensure it can run consistently throughout the academic year.

YOUR Education:

- Resubmission – create a policy concerning resubmissions and in particular focus upon the impact that a 40% cap can have on students' wellbeing and their ability to produce work to the best of their ability.
- 40% Cap – alongside a resubmission policy look further into the university's 40% cap on resubmitted work for assignments and work towards this either being raised or introducing a staggered penalty depending on how late submissions are.

YOUR Experience:

- Communication between faculties and the Student Union - improve the understanding and relationship with academic staff to make them aware of the issues students face.
- Accountability – hold the university accountable for the actions it takes when they affect students ie. strikes and restrictions on free printing
- Inclusivity – create a greater community feel for students in minority groups such as BAME, Community and Part time students etc. As well as this ensure that societies, as well as our sports teams, are being celebrated for their achievements and are as engaged with our university community.

LUCY DIXON (VICE PRESIDENT, EDUCATION & WELFARE)



Voting for Lucy Dixon is a vote for a highly motivated and personable candidate who will empower and represent the **WHOLE** student body.

Hello! My name is Lucy, currently a third year Education Studies and Drama student and I am running for the sabbatical position of Vice President, Education and Welfare. This role has the responsibility to represent the students as learners, as well as focusing on, and ensuring, the wellbeing of every member of the Union. My intention to run is driven by a belief that I can truly represent every student with their education and welfare. Not only that, but I whole-heartedly support what the Student Union represents, this being: educational development, representation, social opportunities and welfare.

I consider myself to be significantly invested with the Student Union, as not only am I a Student Academic Rep (StAR) for my course, but I chaired the Feminist Society last year and am on the current committee for Judo. On top of this, I have also been one of your elected Student Officers for this academic year.

Students pay a large sum to attain a degree; it is only right that your Union holds the University accountable when you do not feel that you are either being represented or listened to. Nothing would give me a greater sense of achievement than for the student body to feel empowered and I feel confident that I will continue the work which ensures students feel that they are respected and heard.

If elected, I would focus on the following:

- **Education:**
 - Continue to build upon and further the Self Certification policy (which is currently in progress), focusing on and reviewing the University conditions of the 40% cap on resubmissions.
 - Encourage better communications from each faculty, so information to all students is consistent, coherent and equal. I would achieve this by having a consistent physical presence on campus – this will be achieved by going into lectures throughout the year. I would also want to liaise with who the students interact with the most – lecturers and program leaders – to ensure you are getting the most out of your education.
- **Welfare:**
 - Welfare is incredibly important for students and therefore crucial for them to know where to go if they need help. Often, Student Services are either too full or cannot fully solve a query. Therefore, I am aiming to expand and continue to advertise the advice centre, as it has proved useful and popular.
 - Provide welfare events that focus on final year students and provide them support during their most stressful times of the year, and around the time they will be leaving – welfare for leaving students sometimes goes unnoticed, it's time this changed.
 - Ensure that specific student demographics, who are not always represented, are catered for and make sure they feel their welfare needs are being met.
- **Environment:**
 - Ensure services within the Union (as well as the administration) are as sustainable as possible.
 - Run workshops events: BOP Swap, recycling information, upcycling clothes etc.
 - Work with the University to minimise the use of single use plastic where we can within the union.

VICTORIA HURLEY (VICE PRESIDENT, EDUCATION & WELFARE)

As your Vice President, Education & Welfare I have spent every day fighting for you and ensuring that your voice, education and well-being is at the centre of every decision made. Representing you has been a dream and I would love to be able to continue the fight, supporting and empowering our students to stand up for what is right.

Over the last 8 months, I have been driven to improve both the Education & Welfare Zones in the Union. However, the fight is not over. There are so many areas of which we need to improve and develop to ensure the best possible student experience.

Education:

1. Run a 'prep for life after Uni' scheme.
-Collaborate with external companies (Banks & Wellbeing practitioners etc) to ensure that we are doing the best possible job of preparing and enabling our students to leave University.
2. Assessment Choices.
-Lobby and work with the University to establish academic systems so that all our students can excel in their assignments by having the choice over their studies.
3. Work with the StARs assistant to increase representation.
-Establish a practical working relationship with the StARs assistant to deliver an improved, more efficient system for the Student Academic Representation scheme.
4. Ensure that there are accessible facilities for students in Study Areas.
-Work with the Library, Student Services etc. to provide easy and accessible information for students in their study spaces e.g. study rooms in the library.
5. Dissertation wellbeing initiatives.
- Having wellbeing & academic support easily accessible for students writing and handing in dissertations.

Welfare:

1. Student Union event staff to have mental wellbeing training.
-Building upon SU staff training that has been increased this year, by having event staff trained in mental welfare for students to ensure their safety.
2. STI health care from professionals around in Freshers Week.
-Being educated and having this service is essential for all students, and by securing this will allow progression of this service throughout the year in future.
3. Sustainable alternatives to keep tackling Period Poverty.
-One of my main focuses this year was tackling Period Poverty by offering free sanitary products to all students. I will develop this campaign by securing sustainable and plastic free alternatives to tackle this crisis.
4. Work and meet with Residential Assistants & Security to audit & monitor onsite accommodation
-One of the areas this role covers is Housing Conditions and I believe that by working with the relevant departments around University to ensure the safety and appropriate living conditions for students.
5. Represent all by ensuring that lecture rooms are accessible for ALL students with physical and invisible disabilities.
-Audit and develop the accessibility of all lecture rooms for the student body.

It's been a privilege to be your Vice President, Education & Welfare but over the next year I want to build a Student Union that you can be proud of and rely on whenever you need it.

LILLY BEACALL (VICE PRESIDENT, ACTIVITIES)

My name is Lilly Beacall and I'm running for your Vice President of Activities for the academic year 2020-2021. I am currently Chair of Performing Arts Winchester, which is the biggest society on campus with over 200 active members. During my time at the University of Winchester, I have come to firmly believe that being part of a society or sports team is vital for your experience at Winchester. The sense of belonging and friendships made within societies and sports teams is something I feel is irreplaceable while at University.

I want to work on showcasing the bonds and friendships made in sports teams, societies and social networks as a way of promoting the teams, societies and social networks to new students, including how inclusive and welcoming they are by promoting prior Student Union campaigns that have been done previously such as This Girl Can and Rainbow Laces. This would also assist new students joining the university that are worried about making friends by encouraging them to join a new group and try something out. I would also like to work with each team, society and social network in publicising themselves over summer to potential new students in a bid to increase member intake.

Societies and Sports Teams would be encouraged to have a more active role in charity events and supporting each other when these events occur. I'd like to work with RAG to assist each team, society and social network in doing this and also encouraging each group to host at least one charity event in the academic year. I would also use the SU Social Medias as a platform to advertise the events.

I would also actively publicise sports fixings, society and social networks events across the SU Social Media Platforms to aim to advertise the amazing things the students do and try to increase audience/participation in these events. By advertising these events, it will encourage fellow students to attend thus increasing member intake as people can watch first-hand what each team, society and social network offer so it becomes an opportunity to advertise for potential members.

Being in a society or sports team helps create the best memories of your time at Winchester, however many new student can be overwhelmed with freshers' week and freshers' fayre so the refreshers fayre is an important event that needs to be advertised more and display more teams and societies. Having a larger refreshers fair would also keep teams, societies and social network's membership consistent across the year, and allow members to sample for activities for themselves. This would also allow for the inclusion of international exchange students in sports teams, societies, and social networks as they are only here for a short time period.

SHIANNE BELL (VICE PRESIDENT, ACTIVITIES)



Vote Shianne as your next Vice President of Activities; to increase student empowerment, recognition and equality.

My name is Shianne Bell, and I am currently studying a Sport Business and Marketing undergraduate degree here at Winchester University. Over the last 3 years of being a student here, I have been involved with the SU in many ways. I am currently the Captain of the Snowsports society, I work as part of the SU bar team and I have previously been a tour leader.

I am running for Vice President (VP) of Activities as I believe I will be able to contribute a lot through the role of VP. Throughout my time as a student, I have become very passionate about the value of the student voice and believe it is vital that students are able to have their say and get the recognition they deserve.

If elected as VP of Activities I will focus on improving 4 key aspects; generating strong sponsorship opportunities, increasing awareness of volunteering and project opportunities, increasing the recognition of all societies and to try and decrease the amount of contact hours given on Wednesday afternoons to increase the inclusivity of participation in extra-curricular activities. My manifesto broken down:

Generating strong sponsorship opportunities.

- Assisting all societies to gain the sponsorships they want and need. This in turn will mean that there will be more funding into their society, allowing the society/sport to progress at a more advanced level. Allowing teams to train for as long as they need, using the correct facilities they need.

Increasing awareness of volunteering and project opportunities.

- Student Union run projects and events need to be made more visible to students through social media and advertising. I also aim to introduce more varied and regular events at the student union, so that there is something for everyone.
- It is important to continue to encourage and support societies hosting their own events and volunteering projects in order to contribute to the student and local community.

Increasing the recognition of all societies.

- The recognition societies get at University is very minimal for the amount they do. Through monthly achievement letters and awards, societies are able to promote themselves in a positive way, in turn increasing the number of people that will join.
- This is not only for sport societies, but it will raise the interest in; academic, art and music societies. This is something that needs to be addressed, as these are the societies that sometimes end up being overlooked for their great achievements. Introducing an event at the end of the year similar to Colours for those non-sporting societies will increase the recognition they deserve.

Decreasing the contact time for all student on Wednesday afternoons.

- If elected I will try to decrease the number of contact hours put on Wednesday afternoons to allow for all students to participate in their extracurricular activities. This is a huge part of mental health and wellbeing. Allowing for students to socialise and exercise is an important aspect to maintain good health and wellbeing and I believe it should be something the University should consider.

As your VP I have seen first-hand the great work you all do and it is one of the things that has made me so proud to be your Vice President, Activities. However, I want to do even more by:


- Creating a tailored points and reward system for our societies and networks.

CHARIS MCCOBB (STUDENT OFFICER)



Election Statement:

A vote for Charis McCobb is a vote for a louder student academic voice and more effective student support.

Manifesto:

This last year, I have had the privilege of being elected a Deputy Chair Student Academic Representative (StAR). This has allowed me to gain a fuller understanding of the inner workings of the Student Union in relation to academic representation. The steps that have already been made towards a more effective academic student voice is incredible, but I believe there is still more that can be done. From experience, I am aware that many students feel unable to share feedback about their course for fear of reprisals. If I am elected, I would strive to encourage students to speak up through working alongside the Vice-President of Education and Welfare to run workshops. These workshops would teach students how to give effective opinions and feedback to their respective StARs. This would enable improvements to the work of StARs as more students would be willing to give opinions. Therefore, there would be more student-led changes to courses. Being a StAR can be a difficult but rewarding position, and I believe that the Student Union should do everything they can to support them and the work they do. Part of this includes working to help other students understand how they can best help their StARs. If I am elected, I would help StARs to communicate with their coursemates, in order to make the work they do clearer.

Another issue that is close to my heart is student welfare and wellbeing. Many students have spoken to me about their difficulties with mental health, and what they think the Student Union could do to better support them. I am aware that the Student Union already do so much for us as students, and it would be impossible to not recognise that. This year, the Student Union have introduced the Advice Centre, which is a massive step in the right direction. If I am elected I would advocate for student drop-in sessions to be organised alongside the Advice Centre. When possible, these drop-in sessions would be attended by professionals from organisations that specialise in mental health. Student Services can often be so busy that they do not have time to see all students. This change would allow for more opportunities for students to talk about any mental health difficulties. I know that for some students, the Student Recharge Days are one of the highlights of their semesters, and it is such a benefit to be able to recharge. However, I believe that more could be done throughout the rest of the year. Having a couple of days dedicated to recharging is incredible, but by spreading a couple of recharge events throughout the rest of the term, students wouldn't need to rely on one day. These events would be similar to the recharge days, but just a single event in order to allow students a small break.


Manifesto
