

CAMPAIGNING FOR YOU

Winchester Student Union delivers campaigns with and for students, to make lasting positive impact to your experience at Winchester. As a democratic organisation, we split our functions into four zones – Education, Welfare, Activities and Services. These zones allow us to organise our goals and impact, hold individuals accountable, and lead on campaign work – whether to redress inequality, resolve an injustice or provide educational improvements, our students are key collaborators in driving forward real change!

OUR EDUCATION ZONE is designed to make recommendations for the improvement of academic provisions of the Student Union, as well as prioritising academic campaigns and initiatives to improve the overall provision of the University's academic departments. This zone is chaired by the Vice President, Education & Welfare, who works alongside the University in various different ways to lobby for a better academic student experience. Over the next year, the Student Union wants to work towards campaigns to lobby for scaled penalties for late submissions of assignments and ensuring the new method of blended (online and face-to-face) learning works for all students.

OUR WELFARE ZONE aims to advocate changes and recommendations for the provision of student wellbeing. Our Advice Centre offers free, independent and impartial support and guidance on a range of issues that may be impacting upon your university experience. We specialise in supporting students through the academic processes of appeals, misconduct or complaints, and the Advice Centre also provides support on issues such as wellbeing, money, and housing. If you are unsure where to go for support, please come to us and we can always signpost you to the appropriate place if necessary. Over the next year, the Student Union Officers hope to carry out campaigns to continue offering free sanitary and sexual health products campus-wide with provisions in place for socially distanced deliveries, campaigns all year round on consent, breaking down taboo topics, mental, physical and sexual health campaigns, and making sure all our students feel safe and supported.

OUR ACTIVITIES ZONE aims to recommend and promote changes to the Student Union's sports teams, societies, representational networks, raising and giving (RAG) activities, and community action projects. The Activities Zone campaigns to promote inclusivity and accessibility within all activities, all the time. This year we will continue to encourage campaigns that support your mental health and wellbeing, we will continue to promote and support our representational networks while regularly celebrating the success of all our activity groups. More than ever we will do everything we can to support and engage our members as getting involved may be challenging this year, whether that be through virtual events, reward schemes, a bigger presence online, or socially distanced fun!

OUR SERVICES ZONE is dedicated to making changes, giving feedback and receiving reports from the commercial services provided by the Student Union. For the coming year, the commercial services such as The Vault, Terrace Bar and the retail shops will be working hard to open as much as possible for student use, whilst maintaining a COVID safe environment and prioritising your safety.

Boys Do Cry

We at Winchester Student Union decided to open the conversation surrounding men's mental health. As a predominately female identifying institution, there is the risk that our male identifying students and communities feel lost and unable to speak out. We created a safe space for our male identifying students to have an open and honest chat about the last time they cried. The campaign went viral with over 100,000 views and made a really positive impact on our students, staff, and wider community.

#ThisGirlCan

In December, Winchester Student Union carried out a 'This Girl Can' campaign week. We chose to take part in this campaign because it's all about celebrating female representation in sport, empowering each other, and breaking the stereotypes which sadly still exist in the sporting industry. Through This Girl Can we wanted to celebrate all our female identifying students who are doing their thing and getting active no matter how they do it, how they look or even how sweaty they get!

Time to Talk Day

We at Winchester Student Union believe it is always time to talk about mental health. We believe it is especially important to talk openly within our activity groups, with our friends, housemates or colleagues, and within our course cohorts. This is why we were so happy and proud to lead and support this campaign.

Rainbow Laces

Throughout February, Winchester Student Union proudly performed our annual lace up in support of Stonewall, to kick homophobia out of sports. With LGBTQPIA+ History Month and Hampshire Pride taking place in February, Winchester Student Union, have and will be, uniting to show and share our support to our LGBTQ+ students, staff and community.

YOUR STUDENT ACADEMIC REPS

Student Academic Representatives (StARs) are elected by you to represent the student voice for everyone on your course. Each year group for each course will elect at least two StARs to represent them. StARs collect opinions on what's going well and what could be improved from classmates, and feedback directly to the programme leader at Student-Staff Liaison Committees (SSLCs). This allows the student voice to be heard, and the changes and opinions are discussed and then are distributed back to the cohort by StARs to keep the students informed of the responses to their concerns and questions.



Want to be the voice of your cohort, influence positive change on your course, earn rewards (StAR points), and have this recognised on your Higher Education Achievement Report (HEAR)? Become a StAR!

StARs are elected in-class in Semester 1. Look out for your Vice President, Education & Welfare who may be dropping into your classes at the start of semester to explain more about the Student Union and the StARs scheme. You can put yourself forward to become a StAR, and you will then receive comprehensive training (and a free StARs hoodie!) to ensure you feel prepared to carry out the role. As a StAR you will be supported throughout the year by the Vice President, Education & Welfare, and you also have access to the StARs points rewards scheme.

WHAT ARE STUDENT UNION FLECTIONS & WHY ARE THEY IMPORTANT?

Winchester Student Union is dedicated to representing you throughout your time at the University of Winchester. We represent all students and do everything we can to ensure you get your voice heard. Your elected Executive Officers sit on a wide range of university committees, including the University's Board of Governors, and each semester we hold open forums at Zone meetings for you to use your voice to shape the Student Union's Education, Welfare, Activities and Services Zones. We also run a variety of schemes, programmes and representation provisions aimed at ensuring change and progress is made to improve your student experience.

Student Union Elections are a legal requirement that allows the organisation to be member-led by you, the students. Look out for Winchester Student Union Executive Officer Elections (Spring Elections) in Semester 2. Be sure to use your voice and vote to elect your Executive Committee: the students who will represent you for the following academic year! The Executive Committee is made up of 3 Sabbatical Officers and 5 Student Officers. Together, they are responsible for promoting and defending the rights of members (students), campaigning on issues affecting members, and the implementation of Student Union policy, amongst many other things. Student Officers are part-time and these positions are suitable for any current student of the University who will remain a student in the 2020/21 academic year. Sabbatical Officers are full-time, paid staff positions of the Union.



YOUR ENTERTAINMENT





The Christmas Market is the highlight of the season which transform the Cathedral grounds into a festive feast of food, drink, gifts and fun!

PUBS OF WINCHESTER

You're never far from a friendly local here, in Winchester. Pubs range from rustic to fancy, and even historic - with England's oldest bar reputably located here. The best of the best of Winchester's licensed venues are those that have achieved the coveted **Best Bar None** Award - look out for this standard across the city.

Don't forget that currently many venues, including Winchester's pubs are unable to run at full capacity and in many cases you will need to book ahead of your visit. Don't forget to also have age ID with you and to make sure you follow any of the rules or guidelines at venues, put in place for your safety.

Almost all pubs in Winchester are members of PubWatch, a partnership of venues that shares information and practice. Importantly this includes banning individuals who fail to adhere to safety guidelines or who behave poorly. This is to protect customers, staff and the integrity of the venues - a ban from one Pubwatch venue, means a ban from all!





WINCHESTER



As a student of the University of Winchester, you are now part of the wider local community. Winchester is a wonderful, welcoming city, and if you're living here during your studies, we're sure you'll come to love this city and all it has to offer even more.

However, it is worth considering that as a member of the community, and particularly if you're living here, there is an expectation that you act to contribute positively to that community. This can be through simple things, such understanding that those around you may have different sleep or working patterns, and you act to moderate your noise accordingly. It might also be remembering to dispose of your rubbish & recycling correctly.

This year your actions to positively contribute to the community are even more important than ever, as we all have a collective part to play in keeping Winchester safe during the Covid-19 pandemic. It is particularly critical for you to know and to adhere to government (and university) regulations regarding covid-19 safety. This includes hand washing, social distancing, the wearing of face coverings, and not holding inappropriate social gatherings. In many cases not following such guidance could put your own, or others, health at risk and may even result in police action/large fines, or exclusion from the University.



YOUR ADVICE CENTRE



Being a student can be fun, rewarding and fulfilling, but we also know it can be challenging, stressful and at times, overwhelming.

Winchester Student Union Advice Centre can be accessed by all current University of Winchester students. We aim to support students to make their own informed choices by offering free, impartial advice and information, on a range of matters.

We operate independently from the University of Winchester and specialise in supporting students with academic issues. We can also advise students on issues such as money worries, wellbeing or problems with housing. If we can't help you we will signpost you on to someone who can!

Rhian, our Student Union Advisor, works closely alongside the Vice President, Education & Welfare and other elected officers, as well as staff from the University, and local and national advice organisations, to ensure we can help make your time as a student as care-free as practicable.

We hope that the information available on our website will be of use to you, if you require further support and would like to get in touch, please complete our Advice Enquiry Form, available online from the link below.

The Advice Centre also provides free condoms, sanitary items, pregnancy tests and personal alarms for all students (subject to availability) - pop in to collect what you need.

WELLBEING SUPPORT

We want everyone to enjoy themselves but also stay safe. Having a few drinks may be a fun part of socialising, but it's important to know your limits. Before arriving in Winchester you may not have been exposed to alcohol or drugs, or maybe you came with concerns about your own or someone else's drinking or drug use.

The NHS advises that you should not drink more than 14 units of alcohol a week on a regular basis – roughly 6 pints, and recommend that you have several consecutive drink-free days each week. If you are worried that you are drinking too much your GP can advise you on how to cut down. Gradually cutting down on the amount you drink over a period of time is much better and easier to stick to than suddenly stopping drinking, especially if you feel you are dependent on alcohol. If you have any concerns or need advice on cutting down, always seek medical advice.

At no point should you feel pressured to drink and get involved in what others are doing, for example to join in with drinking games, if you don't want to. If you are part of a Sports Team or Society it is completely your choice whether or not you attend a social event. Sports and Societies are prohibited from carrying out initiation ceremonies either on or off campus. If you ever feel pressured to take part in social activities as part of a Sports Team or Society, we would strongly encourage you to contact SUActivities@winchester.ac.uk

We'd also encourage you to be vigilant to having alcohol or drugs added to your drink without you knowing, this is known as Drink Spiking. Alcohol is the most common substance used to spike drinks, but in some cases, so-called "date rape drugs" may be used to spike a drink. We offer free drink spiking kits for students as part of the Advice Centre (subject to availability). For more information on recognising the signs to look out for and how to help someone you suspect has been a victim, visit www.winchesterstudents.co.uk/spikeaware

If you are in a situation where urgent medical help is needed and you're not sure what to do, call 111. If you consider the matter to be life threatening, dial 999. You should tell the crew everything you know about the drugs taken and give them any drugs left, it could save the person's life. Remember deep snoring can be a sign of a potentially fatal overdose.

If you suspect that drugs are being used or supplied in Halls or University-managed housing you should contact University Security on 01962 827666.
